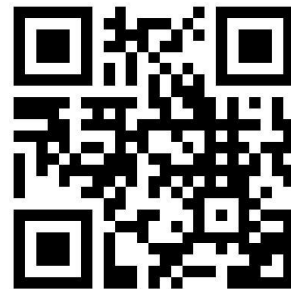
- b) Get into pairs to answer the questions below. Use your notes from task a). When you have answered the questions, switch partners and compare your answers with your new partner.

Cinema, radio and television

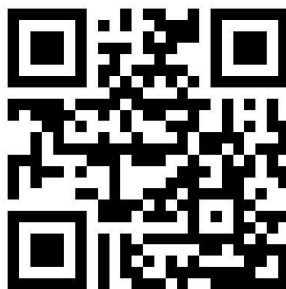

Online dictionary



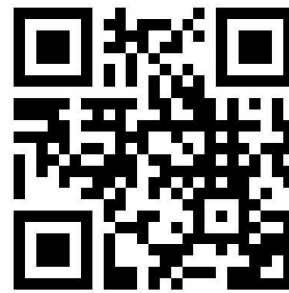
Mind map
